BEST PRACTICES OF THE INSTITUTION.

FORMAT FOR PRESENTATION OF BEST PRACTICE

1. Title of the practice:-ECONOMICALLY POOR STUDENTS' WELFARE SCHEME.[EPSWS]

2. Goal:-Helping the economically poor students through a welfare scheme devised by the college. Students are the most vital component of the educational spectrum and, therefore, their difficulties must be regarded as vital and they are to be resolved on priority to improve-**“quality improvement process.”**

1) Quality is the optimizing one's potential in given socio-familial and environmental contexts.

2) EPSWS is an innovative plan devised and introduced by the college itself.

3) Enhancing learning opportunities by helping the students undergoing grave hardships due to financial exigencies.

4) This scheme was introduced in the session 2008-2009 and is doing well. So far many students have been benefited from it and becoming popular.

3) The context: - depends on many variables such as institutional goals, pedagogic requirements, local context, and nature of learners... (NAAC)

4) The Practice:- To assist, in their journey to progress through education, all genuinely economically backward students of the college, inclusive of all castes, creeds or religions are the beneficiaries.

The main objectives are:-

1) To provide equal opportunities to the students to avail the benefits of education.

2) To include all the students in nation building by way of facilitating their education.

3) To inculcate the values, spirit of coexistence and social responsibilities by making the students collectively participate in the process.

5)Evidence of success:- Since last four sessions general observations and the feedback clearly reveal the following impact of this practice.

1)Regularity in the students to attend the college as they received the assistance in the form of travel expenses.

2)Inculcation of spirit of coexistence and brotherhood and leadership qualities as the students themselves are part of execution of the scheme.

3)Enhancement in confidence level and academic performance among the beneficiary students.

6) Problems encountered and resources required:-

Almost all the students and staff members of the college voluntarily donate the pre decided minimum amount of money for the scheme.

So far 133 students have been benefited through EPSWS. (2008 to 2015)
